Who can apply?

Artists based in Singapore — individuals or collectives.

What is the project timeline?

• Application Deadline: 6 December 2025

• Announcement: 8-12 December 2025

Project Production: Dec 2025 – May 2026

Project Launch: May 2026

Is it open to all art forms?

 Yes. We welcome proposals across visual arts, performance, sound, digital, and participatory practices.

What are you looking for in proposals?

- Innovative, high-quality ideas at the intersection of art and mental health, with the potential to scale and high artistic integrity.
- Projects which have positive impact on mental wellbeing, particularly among local underserved communities.

What settings?

- Healthcare such as hospitals, clinics, care homes and rehabilitation centres.
- Cultural such as galleries, museums, theatres or libraries.
- Community schools, community centres or outdoor public spaces.

Do I need to include a project timeline and expected outcomes?

• Yes. Please outline your project plan, key milestones, and what you hope to achieve.

What support is available?

• Selected artists will receive an artist fee, production funding, mentorship, and professional development training through Healing Arts Singapore partners.

Who selects the artists?

Proposals will be reviewed by curatorial committee made up of local and international
arts and health experts including representatives from the Jameel Arts & Health Lab, the
World Health Organisation, ECCA Family Foundation, University of the Arts Singapore,
National University of Singapore, National Gallery of Singapore and the Institute of Mental
Health.

What happens after selection?

- Successful artists will be announced during Healing Arts Singapore Launch Week.
- Professional Development Training will be led by UAS.
- Production will be supported with resources and guidance.
- Completion of projects will culminate with a public presentation.
